










# St Editha's, Church Eaton

## Graveyard Plan

**Grave Alphanumeric.** The graveyard is divided into 5 areas - A south of the church, B to the west, C to the north and below the path, D north of the path up to the dotted line and E north of that - the churchyard extension created circa 1873. Each grave is allocated an alphanumeric, the first letter shows the graveyard area, the second letter the row in that area (lower case for ashes) and a number to indicate how far the grave is up the row. In addition the church is indicated by SE with a number to identify a grave or memorial within.
